YOUTH LESSON/ACTIVITY ONE "DOING GOOD" by Rev. Ronny Nowell

*NOTE: This lesson/activity is written as the introduction in a three-lesson set related to Week of Compassion and the special offering emphasis. They can be used for three consecutive weeks, or in a more consolidated format.

Age Grades 6-12

Supplies Cell phones OR News Articles

Copies of the "Scripture Hunt" page

Bibles

Pens and paper

Overview

Most Christians seem to think or at least act as if they believe doing good comes naturally. Most Middle School and High School students know better. This lesson will confront the me-first competitiveness of students and help them think about the importance of doing good for others.

Activity

Have youth get in pairs and make sure each pair has a cell phone (or some news articles to look through if your group has lots of kids without phones). Give them a few minutes to search for stories of someone doing something good. As they search, have them keep track of the number of 'good' stories and the number of 'bad' stories.

After a few minutes of searching, have them report back and keep a running total for the group of stories about doing good and stories about doing bad.

In the event there's an imbalance, point out the numbers for each and say, "Doing good doesn't seem very popular!"

Depending on your group, this might be a spark for a short conversation about media production and consumption - what's clickbait? why does it work? do negative headlines catch more attention or get higher placement on a page? etc.

Scripture Search

Hand out the Scripture Hunt page and have youth work in teams to find all the answers or divide them up and give just a few to each group to search for the answers.

Have groups share what they found and what they think it means. Be prepared for some conversation and questions.

Wrapping Up

To help your group members think about doing good, ask them each to finish this sentence:

"A good deed someone could do for me is _____."

The leader could go first to set the tone. Then challenge them to give a quick reaction response: I'll give you exactly 47 seconds to come up with something you really need in your life! Go!

Are there needs that were named that could be met by others in the room right now? ('...tell me a joke to lift my spirits.' ...get help with my math homework.' ...go see the Beyonce concert movie with me.')

Turn the activity back on the youth: "A good deed	dΙ
could do for someone else is	"

The whole point is to connect that sometimes doing good is as simple (and important) as meeting someone's needs! - especially when they've been given the chance to name the need themselves.

Over the next two weeks, we are talking about a ministry of the Disciples church called "Week of Compassion" that meets needs all around the world. Its mission is "to work with partners to alleviate suffering throughout the world, toward the vision of a world where God's people transform suffering into hope." Over the next two weeks we will looking at how Week of Compassion is doing good and meeting needs and how we can be a part of that mission.
